Begun and held in Metro Manila, on Monday, the twenty-third day of July, two thousand eighteen.

REPUBLIC ACT No. 11334

An Act Converting the Marinduque State College in the Municipality of Boac, Province of Marinduque State University, to be Known as the Marinduque State University, and Appropriating Funds Therefor

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippine Congress assembled:

Section 1. Conversion.— The Marinduque State College in the Municipality of Boac, Province of Marinduque including its satellite campuses in the Municipalities of Sta. Cruz, Gasan and Torrijos, is hereby converted state university to be known as the Marinduque State University (MarSu). The main campus of the University shall be in the Municipality of Boac.

Section 2. General Mandate.— The Marinduque State College, hereinafter referred to as the University primarily provide advance education, higher technological and professional instruction and training in education and technology, engineering, environment, agriculture, forestry and fisheries, arts and sciences, business administration and management, health sciences, and other related fields of study. It shall also undertake research and extension services, and provide progressive leadership in its areas of specialization.

Section 3. Curricular Offerings.— The University shall offer undergraduate and graduate courses in the fields of education, science and technology, engineering, environment, agriculture, fisheries, arts and sciences, business administration and management, health sciences and other courses within its areas of specialization and based on its capabilities, and as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its objectives, in meeting the needs of the Province of Marinduque and Region IV-B or the MIMAROPA Region.

The existing high school shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Education (DepEd): *Provided*, That the high school shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the University until the existing students shall have completed their high school education: *Provided, further*, That the University shall operate a reasonably-sized laboratory school under its College of Education: *Provided*, furthermore, That the existing graduate school shall become an integral part of the College of Education.

Section 4. Administration.— The University shall have the general powers of a corporation set forth in Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise known as the "Corporation Code of the Philippines". The administration of the University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested exclusively in the Board of Regents and the President of the University.

Section 5. The Governing Board.— The governing board of the University shall be the Board of Regents hereinafter referred to as the Board, which shall be chaired and co-chaired by the Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the President of the University, respectively, with the following as members:

- (a) Chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture of the Senate;
