REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES Congress of the Philippines Metro Manila

> Seventeenth Congress Third Regular Session

Begun and held in Metro Manila, on Monday, the twenty-third day of July, two thousand eighteen.

REPUBLIC ACT No. 11334

An Act Converting the Marinduque State College in the Municipality of Boac, Province of Marinduque State University, to be Known as the Marinduque State University, and Appropriating Funds Therefor

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippine Congress assembled:

Section 1. *Conversion.—* The Marinduque State College in the Municipality of Boac, Province of Marine including its satellite campuses in the Municipalities of Sta. Cruz, Gasan and Torrijos, is hereby converted state university to be known as the Marinduque State University (MarSu). The mam campus of the Universit be in the Municipality of Boac.

Section 2. General Mandate.— The Marinduque State College, hereinafter referred to as the University primarily provide advance education, higher technological and professional instruction and training in educion science and technology, engineering, environment, agriculture, forestry and fisheries, arts and sciences, bu administration and management, health sciences, and other related fields of study. It shall also undertake reand extension services, and provide progressive leadership in its areas of specialization.

Section 3. *Curricular Offerings.*— The University shah offer undergraduate and graduate courses in the fit education, science and technology, engineering, environment, agriculture, fisheries, arts and sciences, bu administration and management, health sciences and other courses within its areas of specialization and bas its capabilities, and as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its objectives, in meeting the of the Province of Marinduque and Region IV-B or the MIMAROPA Region.

The existing high school shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Edu (DepEd): *Provided*, That the high school shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the C until the existing students shall have completed their high school education: *Provided*, *further*, That the Colleg operate a reasonably-sized laboratory school under its College of Education: *Provided*, furthermore, Th existing graduate school shall become an integral part of the College of Education.

Section 4. Administration.— The University shall have the general powers of a corporation set forth in Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise known as the "Corporation Code of the Philippines". The adminis of the University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested exclusively in the Board of Regen the President of the University.

Section 5. *The Governing Board.—* The governing board of the University shall be the Board of Re hereinafter referred to as the Board, which shall be chaired and co-chaired by the Chairperson of the Comm on Higher Education (CHED) and the President of the University, respectively, with the following as members:

(a) Chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture of the Senate;


