<p>General description of the project (max 250 words)</p>	<p>The objective of the green island initiative, is to promote green principles on the islands of Bau. More importantly, the project is an attempt to encourage communities to adopt green/ blue initiatives to generate wealth and improve well being on the island, therefore ensuring that green economy remains true to the principles of being 'people centered'.</p> <p>In this regard the project is guided by five principles ;          Well being principle- argues that people must remain at the center of green economy and that the objective is focused creating a genuine prosperity and growing wealth that will ultimately support well being. This project will not solely focus on financial gain, but also on social, human, physical and natural capita, and , Justice Principle promotes equity ; by promoting inclusivity , with emphases on leaving no one behind. It places emphases on longterm initiatives and places great emphases on strengthening trust and social ties. The project also promotes Planetary Boundaries principles by nurturing and recognises natures diverse values such as cultural, ecological values and such. It encourages innovation and acknowledges that nature can be substituted to a certain extent, whikst also acknowledging the need for precautionary measures to ensure that crital loss of natural resources including cliamte change. The projectg is also guided by the principle of Efficiency and sufficiency and embraces new models for economic development such as inclusive, low carbon without increasing resource condumtion. Lastly the projectg is guided by Good Governance principles by deploying sound solid science and economies along with local knowledge and adaptive strategie</p>

It is important to note that the project is focused on six vital components ; namely ; Biodiversity conservation, Food Security, Sustainable Livelihood (green blue economic activities (aquaculture/ eco tourism, Clean Transport, Renewable Energy and waste management. Each action identified must be appropriately assessed for its compatibility to the issue being addressed. Hence the Monitoring template will be developed accordingly.</p>
<p>Links between the project and existing conservation and management activities on the island (max 150 words)</p>	<p>The island is surrounded by a number of Marine Protected Areas(MPA), the project is aligned to these principles ; by providing alternative wealth generating initiatives that will ensure that there is compliance to the marine protected areas, but more importantly it will contribute to the MPA initiative by ensuring that people respect the taboo, and that health of the natural ecosystems remains vibrant.</p>


